

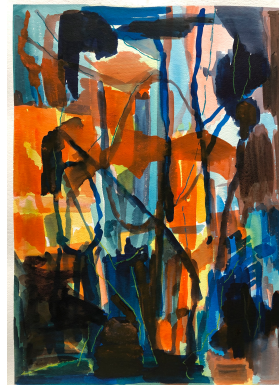

ABOUT THE EXHIBITION:

Laura White and Mark Wright, have been partners in life for 25 years, but this is their first two-person show together. While their individual styles may seem distinct, the exhibition's title, *Sottobosco* – Italian for 'undergrowth' – hints at their shared affinity for nature. Inspired by the 17th-century Dutch genre of painting, the artists explore non-representational nature, evoking natural forms without direct depiction.

Sculptor Laura White's diverse materials range from ceramics to silicone and ink, each chosen to enhance her tactile exploration. White's 'Terminal Flare' series showcases the dynamic interaction between silicone rubber and her sculptural intent, while 'Pollute Volute: Adaptive 2' captures the fluidity of her creative process, intertwining her body's movements with her artistic vision.

Mark Wright, on the other hand, begins his paintings with photographic landscapes, which he then transforms into fragmented abstractions. Influenced by artists like Paul Gauguin and Willem de Kooning, Wright's layered compositions invite viewers to explore the interplay of distance, movement, and colour.
